The Collective Bargaining Agreements (CBA's) covering Philippine seafarers

are based on negotiations between the Norwegian Shipowners' Association (NSA) and The Associated Marine Officers' and Seamen's Union of the Philippines (AMOSUP), The Norwegian Maritime Officers' Association (NMOA) and The Norwegian Union of Marine Engineers (NUME).
